

Questions for Consideration—*With the Master Remembering Precious Truths*
Lesson 1— The Precious Person, Peace, Power and Promises of Christ—2 Peter 1:1-4.

1. (a) Read 2 Peter. (b) What are some common themes or words you see repeated? (c) What do you think the theme is of this epistle?
2. Memorize 2 Peter 1:3
3. (a) Why do you think that Peter calls himself Peter in 1 Peter, but in 2 Peter, he calls himself Simon Peter? (b) Look up at least ten passages that pertain to Peter. (You might need a concordance for this.) What do you learn about Peter, the apostle, from the verses you looked up? (c) How would you summarize this man Peter in one sentence?
4. (a) Peter writes in 2 Peter 1:3 that His divine power has given us all things pertaining to life and godliness. What else has His divine power done according to John 17:2; 2 Corinthians 12:9; Ephesians 1:19-21; Colossians 1:16 and Hebrews 1:3? (b) What has His divine power done in your life? (c) What are some of the substitutes that Christians cling to when needing solutions to their problems? (d) Since God promises that we have all we need for life and godliness, why do you think we often run to outside sources?
5. (a.) What is the first promise in the Bible? (See Genesis 2). (b) What is the last promise in the Bible? (See Revelation 22) (c) Pick at least three other books of the Bible and find one promise given.
6. (a) What are some of your favorite promises in the Word of God? (Peter mentions in 2 Peter 1:4 that He has given us exceedingly great and precious promises.) (b) Why are these promises precious to you?
