

**Questions to Consider—With the Master in Heavenly Places—Lesson 10—  
Ephesians 4:1-6—The Believer’s Conduct in Light of Their Calling**



1. (a) According to Ephesians 4:1-6 what are the virtues God’s children should possess? (b) Why do you think Paul emphasizes the word “one” (actually seven times) in these verses?

2. Memorize Ephesians 4:1.

3. (a) In this passage Paul lists several ways in which we can walk worthy of our calling. According to the following verses, what are some other ways we can conduct our Christian walk in a manner worthy of our calling? Romans 12:1, 2; Romans 13:13; Colossians 1:10; Colossians 2:6, 7; 1 Thessalonians 4:1-7. (b) What other ways do you think believers can walk worthy of their calling?

4. (a) The book of Numbers (12:3) records for us that Moses was the meekest man on the earth (at that time). From the facts you already know about Moses (or from facts you can look up), why do you think this is true?

5. (a) Who in Scripture comes to your mind as someone who was longsuffering (besides the Lord) and what do you learn from his/her life? (b) Who do you know that is living today who is an example of possessing the quality of longsuffering and what do you learn from his/her example?

6. Would you say your life is being conducted in the manner that Paul speaks of in Ephesians 4:2 and 3? Is there something that you need to change in order to be conformed to Christ’s image? The following questions might be helpful in deciding what you need to change: Are you quick to get angry? You need to work on patience. Are you proud, boastful? You need to work on humility. Are you bossy and rough with your words? Then you need to work on being gentle. Are you intolerant of other’s shortcomings? You need to work on bearing with others in love. (These are private questions to answer.)

7. After considering question 6, write a prayer request to be shared with your group.
